


Protect our kids!

There is grass accumulating in some of our coves in areas where the water is shallow and has direct

sunlight. This condition causes rapid growth of a variety of underwater grass. The county agent, Frank Gillian and a contractor met to discuss the type of grass and the means of removing it. The county agent, along with personnel from Miss State have decided the best way to deal with this issue is 3-fold:

1. Treat with chemicals to kill the grass. This will not cause an contamination to our lake, nor harmful to humans or animals. It will be applied in granular form to the areas most heavily affected. This should kill the grass and cause it to rise to the surface.
2. Fertilizing the lake will be done immediately after the granules have been applied to the grass. This will cause the water to darken, allowing less sunlight to penetrate, which deters the growth.
3. Grass eating carp: we have in the past, applied carp to our lake that can help maintain the growth of grass. Carp were added several years ago and we do not know how many are still in the lake, but we will follow Lake Management to advise us of the number of carp we need to add.

Hopefully this will bring a solution to the grass problem in our lake.



Chara: Chara is easily distinguished from other macroalgae by its rough texture and strong musty or garlic-like odor. Individual internodes, or false "stems," have whorls of six to eight branchlets that do not have further branching. Prefers hard water.

Our guest for this meeting were: John Adcock, Ben Snow and Robert Donnell who discussed the proposed City of Bellevue, John Adcock gave us the current status on Bellevue's annexation by the city of Hattiesburg. Hattiesburg is still taking depositions and the Bellevue leadership is working with Lamar County against the annexation.

Frank Gillian discussed the safety of the lake. The safety/lake committee will meet this week.

We are planning to paint Heron Cove decks this week and Crane Park decks next week.

We are also clearing out some of the tree overhangs on the roads.

Old Business – Brenda suggested that the Sunset Social next year be earlier, in April instead of May, so that it would not interfere with graduations.

New business: A letter from a homeowner was received addressing several issues, which were discussed by the board.

We have had several questions about ARC. The board supports the submission of plans
